John A. Tuell currently serves as the Executive Director for the Robert F. Kennedy National Resource Center for Juvenile Justice at the Robert F. Kennedy Children's Action Corps. Prior to this appointment, from 2001 – 2009 Mr. Tuell served as the Director of the MacArthur Foundation's Models for Change: Systems Reform in Juvenile Justice Initiative at the Robert F. Kennedy Children's Action Corps. Mr. Tuell has been an author and/or contributing author to numerous publications and issue briefs that support the work of the Dual Status Youth Initiative and Probation System Review, and related issues impacting the juvenile justice

system and related youth serving systems. Prior to the MacArthur Foundation work in 2001, Mr. Tuell served in the U.S. Department of Justice from 1997-2001, during which time he was the Deputy Director of the State Relations and Assistance Division in the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP). Mr. Tuell worked from 1979-1997 in the Fairfax County, Virginia Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court.
